

# **Bude Community Network**




This document sets out headline figures for the Bude Community Network Area (CNA) highlighting how it compares to Cornwall across a variety of topics. Community network figures have been built from neighbourhood data. Availability of parish data is limited.





**Bude Community Network** has 16,879 residents; 3.2% of Cornwall's total population. The workday population is 16,314 so 565 people (net) commute out of the network area to work.

## Network population growth 2001 – 2011




Throughout this document we make reference to 'neighbourhoods'. These are small geographical areas which have between 1,000 and 3,000 people living in them. They are defined by the Office of National Statistics (ONS) and sometimes called Lower Super Output Areas (LSOA).



The number of adults living alone is increasing as lifestyles change and people live longer. This can contribute to housing demand.





820 households live in social rented housing in the Bude CNA, which is lower (11.2%) than the Cornwall average (12%) as shown in the chart left. The range across the neighbourhoods is highest (29.5%) in Bude East (242 properties) and lowest (1.1%) in Poughill and Flexbury East (9 properties).

5,232 homes are owned or shared ownership (71.3%) compared with 69.6% average in Cornwall. The range across the network shows the highest concentration (14.4%) is in Week St Mary and Whitstone (756 properties) and the lowest (8.3%) is in Bude East (434 properties).

Homechoice is the register to apply for social housing vacancies and affordable housing in Cornwall. This information is intended as a guide only. Data includes only those currently living in Cornwall. Some people may require a connection to a local area and may not be eligible for housing.

Deprivation (Index of Multiple Deprivation (IMD) 2010, HMRC 2012/13)

Bude Community Network has no neighbourhoods classified as highly deprived (in the top 20% most deprived in England). The average across Cornwall is 9.8% of the population living in a highly deprived area. 18.9% of children aged under 16 in Bude CNA are living in poverty compared with 18.1% across Cornwall.

Not every person in a highly deprived area will themselves be deprived. Equally, there will be some deprived people living in the least deprived areas.

There is variation across the network with some areas ranked as more deprived than others. Although Bude network doesn't have any areas in the top 20% the following neighbourhoods are rank in the top 30% of deprived neighbourhoods in England:

Bude East

People in deprived areas are more likely to have a lower life expectancy and spend more of their life in poor health, having higher illness and disease levels.

**Healthy weight** (National Child Measurement Programme 2012/13 and QOF Disease Register 2012/13)

11% of children leaving primary school in Bude CNA are obese, while a further 16.5% are classed as overweight. This compares with an average of 16.3% obese and 14.7% overweight across Cornwall and Isles of Scilly.

Figures for adult obesity are not available by community network. GP clinical registers for Cornwall indicate 13.4% of patients aged 16 and over were obese (BMI of 30 or over).

### Natural and cultural assets (Cornwall Council July 2014)

Bude CNA includes the Hartland and Pentire Point to Widemouth sections of the Cornwall AONB<sup>1</sup>. It also includes several small medieval towns such as Kilkhampton, as well as the historic nineteenth century port of Bude itself. The landscape incorporates some of the least altered medieval field systems in Cornwall, the designated Civil War battlefield at Stratton and the early nineteenth century Bude Canal, which straddles the Cornwall-Devon border. SSSIs<sup>2</sup> for the area include Greenamoor, Brendonmoor, Lymsworthy Meadows, Grimscott, Brendon and Vealand Fen, Kingford Fen, Steeple Point to Marsland Mouth, Duckpool to Furzey Cove, Boscastle to Widemouth and Marsland to Clovelly Coast.

### Neighbourhood development plans (Cornwall Council July 2014)

A neighbourhood development plan for Bude-Stratton Town Council has been agreed and is in production. In addition, St Gennys Parish Council has expressed an interest for producing a plan in their area.

### Community assets (Cornwall Council July 2014)

Bude CNA currently has one asset listed as an Asset of Community Value in the network; The Bullers Arms at Marhamchurch.

### **Employment by sector**

Bude Community Network has more people working in the construction industry (12%) compared to the Cornwall average (9.1%). There are also significantly less people working in the human health and social work activities (8.7%) than the Cornwall average (13.4%).

### **Economic activity**

Bude network has considerably more people in self-employment (18.1%) than the Cornwall average (13.6%). This is linked to its coastal location and the higher number of people employed in the accommodation and food service, which is the third highest employment sector in Bude.

An estimated 4.2% of young people aged 16-19 are not in education, employment or training in the CNA, compared to the Cornwall average of 3% (March 2014).

### Qualifications

People in Bude Community Network have similar levels of qualifications to the Cornwall averages, with higher numbers of people with NVQ level 1 or 2 qualifications, (equivalent to GCSE D-G or A\*-C respectively).
